And they went to a place called Gethsemane. And he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I pray." And he took with him Peter and James and John, and began to be greatly distressed and troubled. And he said to them, "My soul is very sorrowful, even to death. Remain here and watch." And going a little farther, he fell on the ground and prayed that, if it were possible, the hour might pass him. And he said, "Abba, Father, all things are possible for you. Remove this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will." And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour? Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak." And again he went away and prayed, saying the same words. And again he came and found them sleeping, for their eyes were heavy, and they did not know what to answer him. and he came the third time and said to them," Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? It is enough; the hour has come. The Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us be going; see, my betrayer is at hand." Mark 14:32-42

Of members and friends of Hillside church, I only know two people who have gotten COVID-19, and they both have recovered. We can be proud of that! All our sacrifice and saying "no" has made a difference. And there is incredible hope with the first vaccine coming out!

We can do this. Not only can we do it, we can also encourage and help each other stay strong when we feel too tired to stay awake. It is my love for you and my love for our community that I desire to stay strong and vigilant. I will continue to sacrifice now, so that when the time is right, I can be with you all IN PERSON again.



CHRISTMAS OFFERING

This year's Christmas offering will be given to the Salvation Army HEAT Share program. HeatShare is a program that provides emergency utility assistance for people with no place left to turn. The program is funded in part by Salvation Army donors and by local utility companies and their customers. Funds are typically used to pay for natural gas, oil, propane and electricity. The program has provided more than \$40 million worth of assistance to over 150,000 households since 1982. Annually, about 4,700 households receive an average of \$370 to keep their homes warm.

Year after year, requests for assistance are typically greater than the available resources, so Salvation Army relies on donations to continue to help those in need. This year, due to COVID, they expect even more requests.



Administrative Council Meeting Minutes December 1, 2020 via ZOOM

<u>Online Attendance</u>: Carolyn Dahl, Diane Boris, Jim Leland, Carole Hawkinson, Julie Manisto, Sandy Wilmot, Pastor Cynthia

Carolyn called the meeting to order. Pastor Cynthia gave a devotion on Advent. In Advent we are waiting and preparing for peace, love and hope. She asked us what was something that gives us hope. Bentleyville, counting blessings, and a vaccine that will be out soon were a few things mentioned.

<u>Secretary's Minutes:</u> The minutes of the secretary's minutes for October were reviewed. One change was made. Even though we don't have a Boy Scout troop right now, they filed bankruptcy to protect themselves from a lawsuit against pedophiles. A motion was made by Carole and second by Pastor Cynthia that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>**Treasurer & Financial Report:**</u> The Treasurer's report was reviewed as of the end of November. The Thanksgiving offering was \$115. A little more has come in since this report was made out. We have heard from the bank that the CARES Loan has been forgiven and will not have to be paid back.

Stewardship: \$34,470. has been received In pledges so far for the 2021 budget.

<u>**Pastor's Report</u>**: She is pleased with the Advent giving so far. - Toys, warm clothes and food. The men's bible study is on hold for December. She has been doing a lot of recording for the Sunday online service and making calls to our church members.</u>

SPRC: They met with the District Superintendent and discussed how things are going. We need to have a charge conference to approve the salary package for Pastor Cynthia. We discussed a raise for our secretary. \$2.00 an hour was agreed on. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Sandy to raise the salary of the secretary \$2.00 an hour beginning in January 2021. Motion approved. End of the year bonuses was discussed for our two employees. A motion was made by Sandy and second by Carole to give our two employees \$100 each out of the budget for SPRC. Motion approved.

<u>**Trustees**</u>: There is nothing to report on. Our parking lot on the other side of Piedmont Avenue has been emptied. The car was towed away and the boat and camper were moved out of the parking lot.

<u>Mission:</u> Hats, mittens and warm clothing was collected last month and given to Union Gospel Mission and Chum. The Loaves and Fishes mission will be given \$75 to buy food for a dinner in December. Because of the pandemic, we don't want to go to the store and shop.

Worship: Worship will be online through Christmas and probably longer. We should take out "no collection of things" from our Reopening Policy. We are collecting items to be distributed for the needy in the church. Pastor Cynthia has talked to a few people who are willing to be on a committee. Dave McKowski is willing to be on Finance or SPRC, Jan Barker and Jim McLaughlin are willing to be on Education, and Sandy Dahl is willing to be on SPRC. Pastor Cynthia has requested all the members of the Ad Council stay on for next year. Everyone agreed to stay on.

<u>Other:</u> The date for the next meeting is January 5, 2021 via ZOOM. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Carole and seconded by Carolyn. Meeting adjourned.
