Pastor's Ponderings...

Jesus: Way Maker

"Jesus crossed the lake again, to the other side...". Mark 5:21

Jesus the Way Maker. That was the theme of this year's Minnesota Annual Conference. LeRoy Britton, Hillside's lay leader, and I met for three days online (and some in person too) with the rest of the clergy and lay leaders around Minnesota. We spent these days being inspired by Bishop Bard, other speakers and preachers, and each other.

Bishop Bard noted that the Minnesota Conference has been working with a map of our Journey Toward Vitality. (You can view the map on page 2 of this newsletter) It has a river running through the center—a river of vitality that identifies the mission of the church as growing in love of God and neighbor, reaching new people, and healing a broken world. The map identifies core values affirmed by the conference: being rooted in Jesus, grounded in Wesleyan theology, inclusive of all persons, and engaged in the work of justice and reconciliation. The map is beautiful, and yet, just as Minnesotans know firsthand the havoc that both winter and construction have on roads, we know there will be unforeseen portages, unmarked rocks in the streams, unknown rapids to navigate, unexpected potholes and detours in our journey as a conference.

The stories of Jesus teach us time and time again to embrace new learning and be willing to cross **boundaries.** "We live in a time where adaptive change is needed in the church and in the world, and the essence of adaptive change is learning. We need to learn, be open to the new, and be willing to cross boundaries as we draw maps of where we are and where we need to go."

We always need to be prepared to revise our maps, said Bard. "My vision for the future of the Minnesota Conference is that we are a spacious conference. God has a mission in the world, and love is at the heart of that mission. It is a heart-enlarging mission. It is a world-shaking mission. It is a



Due to a 30% increase in costs for durable goods, the increased cost of fuel, and the intense climate changes we are currently experiencing, the cost to provide all of the food and supplies for our drivethrough & delivery service across Duluth, has put a burden on our ability to handle the load. We have all noticed these small increases in our own lives. but covering the cost of a simple can of soup for every visitor to the CHUM Food Shelf... almost \$900 a month, and that is with our Second Harvest discounts! We need your help to keep the supplies coming through our doors and out to our friends and neighbors in need throughout the community. **BACKPACK DRIVE UPDATE:** The Backpack Drive disbursement will take place on August 24th. In-Person & Zoom Administrative Council Meeting: July 13, 2021

Attendance; In-Person - Diane Boris, Julie Manisto, Pastor Cynthia, Jim Leland, Sandy Wilmot, ZOOM on line – Carolyn Dahl

Carolyn opened the meeting with a prayer.

The Admin Council minutes for June were approved. The motion was made by Sandy and second by Julie.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed. The Love Offering total to date is \$165.00. There is \$390.00 left to buy food and make dinners for Loaves & Fishes. We are sending 78% of our apportionments to the conference each month. They now need it broken down as to how we are dividing this money.

Finance Report: The PPP loan has been forgiven. We do not have to pay it back. \$100.00 has been given to the Memorial Fund in memory of Jack Frestedt.

Pastor's Report: The day camp for the kids had to be cancelled. There were only 11 children signed up and we need at least 20 to make it feasible. Possible reasons for so few children were – no vaccines for younger children, no transportation this year, we could not use the Horace Johnson Boy Scout Camp at Island Lake, other activities and family vacations. They have planned to have a Wednesday evening session at Park Point for the children. The city is going to have National Night Out again. We will not be participating this year. Pastor Cynthia will be on vacation that week. We held the funeral for Jack Frestedt at our church and served the luncheon. There were 100 people in attendance. The family was pleased with the funeral. It was quite a challenge getting to the Veteran's Cemetery in Saginaw with all the construction going on.

SPRC: We need a secretary again. We will pay \$15/hr for 10-12 hours a week. We will ask other Methodist churches if they know of anyone who would like the job. Otherwise, we need to advertise for one. Kathleen will work for us until the middle of August.

Trustees: No report.

Mission: We prepared and sent a hot meal to Loaves & Fishes today. They were happy to receive a hot prepared meal again. It has been almost 1½ years since we have been able to send a prepared meal. We are still collecting food for the Food Shelf. We need to ask Bill Palusky if he and his friend still want to deliver the food each month.

Worship: In-person worship attendance has been from 20 to 40 people each Sunday. Fellowship time has started again. We are still not passing the offering plates. One is put at the front of the church and one at the back for people to put their offering in.

Other: We would like to have a modified meatball dinner this fall (take out only) but Carole and Carolyn need someone to take over the responsibility. There would be no serving meals in the dining room. We don't have enough people to do this. Julie, Sandy & Jim offered to meet with Carole and Carolyn to learn what needs to be done on July 20th. Pastor Cynthia asked us spend time in prayer each day asking God for guidance, help and wisdom for Hillside UMC. Next month Ad Council will meet on Aug. 10 at 7PM.
