God With Us: Emmanuel

Draw near to God, and God will draw near to you. James 4:8

Social distancing has become a way of life. When people come closer than six feet, it might cause a bit of anxiety. What a strange and alienating reality.

But, God created us for connection. Our brains are wired to want and crave mental and physical connection. Even when we can't draw physically near to others, the scriptures tell us that if we draw near to God, God will be there. Nothing is standing in the way.

Jesus came to connect with people. In the flesh, human form, through Jesus God said "I am here with you! You don't need a go-between. You don't need to dress up. You don't need to go to a church building. You don't need to get on your knees and fold your hands. There is no perfect formal formula needed to draw near to God. Social distancing is not required.

Sometimes we confuse reverence with formality, but God doesn't need a black-tie affair for a personal relationship. God is with us.
