"be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind; In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Philippians 2:1-11

Have you ever changed your mind about something? Not a little thing, like which restaurant you are going to, or what TV show you are going to watch. Something big. Something that really affected how you live. A new mind-set.



Our mind-set refers to the fundamental foundation upon which we build our lives, the internal frame of reference which we perceive everything else. It's the hard drive of our internal computer that directs all of our actions.



CHUM Opens New Lincoln Park Warming Center in Early February

A new CHUM Warming Center is located at the Lincoln Park Community Center, 2014 W. 3rd Street, and open from 6 p.m. to 8 a.m. seven days a week from November 1, 2021, to March 31, 2022. Warming Centers are a safe and welcoming space where people can stay warm.

At the Lincoln Park CHUM Warming Center, people can stay overnight. The new facility offers handicap-accessible restrooms and three showers. The warming center's capacity is up to 100 people depending on staff availability.

The Lake Superior Community Health Center will provide services at the Warming Center every other week. The Warming Center is a partnership between CHUM, St Louis County, the City of Duluth, Duluth HRA, and Loaves & Fishes.

Additionally, the CHUM Drop-In at 125 N. 1st Ave. West is also open 24 hours as a Warming Center.



Zoom & in Person Administrative Council Meeting February 1, 2022

Attendance: Diane Boris, Sandy Wilmot, Jim Leland, Carolyn Dahl, Carole Hawkinson, LeRoy Britton, Dave McKowski, Pastor Cynthia

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

Pastor Cynthia asked us what is our soul. It is different for everyone. It is deeper than just saying doing fine.

The January Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by LeRoy that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report was reviewed. Not much to report on in January. The Christmas Offering was sent to Campus Ministries. Our apportionments in the 2022 Budget were set at \$10,400 but they have been reduced to \$9,600.

Finance Report: Nothing new to report on.

Pastors Report: Bible study will continue on Jan 11 and is going well. It is on Zoom and in person. Phyllis Peterson is our CHUM Delegate. Brenna is doing fine with the little ones. She would like some curriculum to work with. On Ash Wednesday there will be a noon service at Hillside and 7 PM service at Copper Top. It will be the same service and the 7 PM service will also be online. A Lenten Study will replace Bible Study during the 6 weeks of Lent. It will start the week after Ash Wednesday. Pastor Cynthia sent a notice to the area churches to see if they are interested in Day Camp this summer. Those she has heard from say the children have not come back to church since covid. We need someone to hook up the Power Point on Sundays when Pastor Cynthia can't be there. She is talking to Jeannette about an e-newsletter to replace the paper copy, but some people don't have a computer or know how to use one and some people would rather have a paper copy.

Lay Leader: LeRoy gets together with other lay leaders from around the state online. They have a meeting once a month and the next one will be Thursday. They discuss how churches are doing, if they are growing and if they have kids coming to church. Pastor Cynthia is glad for his dedication and would like to see if any new ideas are working.

SPRC: There is a training for new SPRC members online with Susan Nienaber on Thursday, February 10, 6:30 to 8:30.

Trustees: The Boy Scouts that normally meet at Trinity church have not met here yet. Our neighbor has talked to us again about the water from our parking lot coming into his yard. We have had the city look at the situation and nothing can be done about it. Water runs downhill. He has called the police on us, and the police say we aren't doing anything wrong. We are using an old laptop that needs updating but it is too old to be updated. A new one would cost \$1,355 for the computer, software & labor. After some discussion a motion was made by Carole and seconded by Diane that we buy the new computer and software. Motion approved.

Mission: We currently have two missions. The Food Shelf and Loaves & Fishes. Sunday, February 6 Pastor Cynthia has asked everyone to bring an item for the Food Shelf. We will prepare and bring a hot meal to Loaves & Fishes on Tuesday, February 8. A member of a Lutheran church would like to know if anyone would like to help explore and work to ending predatory lending. ex. Loans before payday at high interest rates.

Worship: Two 4-drawer file cabinets are full of music. We don't know what to do with it. We will ask the Choir Director at Copper Top if they can use it. A church in Bloomington has had a water pipe break that ruined their music. We will ask them if they can use it also. Hymnals are also becoming dinosaurs.

Other: Our Bishop wants to leave the COVID policy up to each congregation. They can decide how much COVID Is in their county and city and make any changes. We do not know of anyone in our church who currently or recently had COVID. Our next meeting is March 1 at 7 PM. Pastor Cynthia gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned.
