Pastor's Ponderings...

"Mary stood outside the tomb crying. She turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but did not realize that it was Jesus. He asked her, "Why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means teacher). Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me..." John 20:11-16



Have you ever heard yourself use the phrase, "the good old days"? Have you ever tried to make something in your life be how it used to be, only to find out that you really couldn't do it? I wonder if Mary, when she realizes she is talking to the risen Jesus at the tomb, thinks that because Jesus is alive, things are going to go back to how they used to be. You know, the good old days!

But you and I know that life isn't stagnant or still. It ebbs and flows; kids grow up and move away, you get a new job, move, retire, people you love die, people get married, people get divorced, people get sick, they get cancer, a deadly new virus attacks the world, and all of a sudden things aren't how they used to be.

will be available to view on YouTube any time afterward. Pastor Cynthia will lead at Hillside and Pastor Jeanine at Coppertop.

sanctuary – honoring or in memory of loved ones. Jeannette works Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 AM to 2 PM. We will need your order by April 12, so don't delay.

Our hope is that we can purchase these lilies at one of the retail stores at a very reasonable price and then have you pay for yours after Easter. If this way appeals to you, please don't hesitate to order right away. If you prefer to bring your own spring plant, rather than buy a lily, it needs to be at the church by 10 AM Saturday, April 16.

COVID-19 Protocol Update: Given the significant decline in positive Covid-19 rates in our area, your Church Council has decided to adopt the following approach as we transition to an endemic way of being together. We are doing this with real time monitoring, so protocols are subject to change if data changes. Your Ad Council takes into consideration the case rate in St. Louis County, the Bishop's recommendation, and the CDC and the MDH recommendations. Here is the current plan:

- Masks will be encouraged and available but not required on Sunday mornings.
- Coffee and goodies will be available before worship in the fellowship hall at 10:30 AM.
- Children's staff will continue to wear masks and sanitize all toys and play area.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

Pastor Cynthia asked us where do you see God working, Answers: lighting the Aerial bridge yellow and blue for Ukraine, the Food Shelf, having two new visitors, speaking out against the war in Ukraine.

The February Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The Treasurer's report was reviewed. The Christmas Offering of \$786.00 was sent to Campus Ministries. The cost of snow removal this season is up.

<u>Finance Report:</u> We are wondering if we should start passing the offering plates. Giving in February was down. No action was taken. The computer program we use for membership and financial giving is being raised from \$50 to \$67 a month.

Pastors Report: Lent begins tomorrow. At noon tomorrow, Hillside will have an Ash Wednesday service. Coppertop will have their service at 7 PM. It will be live streamed at 7 also. At 5 PM there will be a children's time. Lenten Study begins next Tuesday. They will use the book called Living with the Mind of Christ. Books are not available. An e-book is available. Regarding Summer Day Camp, only Coppertop and Hillside have kids coming back to church since COVID. There will be no Day Camp this year. We will do something for a week with the Coppertop and Hillside kids. Pastor Cynthia would like to have barbecues after Sunday service in July and August. Because the neighborhood is changing, we would like to invite the neighbors also. We are thinking we should order take-out supplies for our meatball dinner in the fall now because of supply delays. We also need organizers.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: Karen watched the training video for new SPRC members online February 10. The staff is doing well. If Brenna is going to be a Sunday school Teacher, that has always been a volunteer position, not a paid position. We will change her title to Children's Ministry.

<u>Trustees:</u> Our insurance is going up \$600 this year. We are not covered for disease or illness that expense that can be traced to our church. The semi-annual maintenance has been performed on the elevator. We have some problem with the building heaving with the frost. The elevator door only opens half way. We don't want anyone to force it open until the frost leaves the building. The laptop has been purchased, installed and is in use. We need to have snow removed from the parking lot. It will cost \$1,000 to have someone remove it. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that we hire the snow removal in the parking lot for \$1,000. Motion approved.

<u>Mission:</u> A meal will be made and delivered to Loaves & Fishes the second Tuesday of March. March is a special time for the Food Shelf and CHUM. For each dollar donated to the food shelf, they will be able to buy \$7.00 worth of food.

Worship: The sanctuary elements have been switched to Lent. This coming Sunday will be communion Sunday. There are Lenten Devotional books available near the upstairs entrance to the Sanctuary.

Other: We discussed starting a social time with coffee before the church service and it was decided we will start it up again and the treats must be store bought. A motion was made by Davd and second by Pastor Cynthia that we start having coffee on March 13. Motion approved. Our next meeting is April 5 at 6:30PM. We are going to try having the meeting a little earlier. Pastor Cynthia gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned.
