Pastor's Ponderings... Double Check the Recipe

God's anger is but for a moment; God's favor is for a lifetime. Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes in the morning. – Psalm 30:5

The other day, Jojo made her famous chocolate chip cookies. Except they didn't turn out right. Something was wrong. The cookies were flat and crispy. They weren't soft and chewy.

She tried again and discovered her mistake. The difference was just 1/2 cup of flour. But from our first bites of that second batch of cookies, we knew: Yes! That's the way they should be.

Baking is a delicate balance. So is faith.

Easter, like Lent, is supposed to be a season. Fifty days stretching to Pentecost. Seven weeks of celebration, resurrection, and joy. It's called Eastertide. Don't feel bad if you didn't know. I didn't.

Many of us observe 40 days of Lent when we give things up or take things on. We remember we are dust on Ash Wednesday and receive the cross on our foreheads.

Then, for one glorious morning, it's lilies and trumpets and candy-filled plastic eggs; 40 parts Lent to 1 part Easter. Is that the right recipe?

Nope. Check again. The recipe calls for 50x that much! Fifty times as many rolled away stones and empty tombs! Fifty times as many hallelujahs!

Imagine the difference. In your life. In your church. In our world. That's a much better cookie.

The balance is off. It's time to check the recipe. Welcome to Eastertide.

Each year, churches in the Minnesota Annual Conference take a Love Offering for missions in conjunction with our Annual Conference Session. The theme of the 2022 Annual Conference — which will take place May 24-25 — is "Jesus: Healer." Pastor Cynthia and Leroy Britton, your lay leader will be

attending the conference on behalf of Hillside.

Bishop David Bard invites congregations to pray about and participate in the Love Offering as a generous expression of God's wild and extravagant love. "Even in difficult times, Minnesota United Methodists have shown themselves to be generous in sharing the healing love of Jesus," he said. "Our world confronts countless challenges, and though one offering cannot meet or overcome them all, it can do good and bring healing in the name and spirit of Jesus."

Our Love Offering this year will go to three Minnesota United Methodist food ministries. Funds will also assist those in need in our nation and world by supporting Red Bird Missionary Conference in Appalachia and Volunteers in Mission trips. The funds from this year's offering will to go to:

- The Red Bird Missionary Conference in Appalachia (40 percent)
- Food insecurity across Minnesota (50 percent, divided among the three ministries): Holy Grounds at Centenary UMC, Mankato (17 percent; Simpson Food Pantry, Minneapolis (17 percent); and West African Family and Community Food Shelf, Brooklyn Center (17 percent)
- Volunteers in Mission scholarships (10 percent)


We will be looking for volunteers to grill and hand out hot dogs. (A grill has been donat-



Hillside United Methodist Church Zoom & in Person Administrative Council Meeting April 5, 2022

<u>Attendance:</u> Diane Boris, Jim Leland, Carolyn Dahl, Carole Hawkinson, Dave McKowski, Karen Bailey, Pastor Cynthia, LeRoy Britton

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

Pastor Cynthia asked us how are we taking care of our spiritual life.

The March Admin Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The Treasurer's report was reviewed. Last month we sent \$638 to CHUM and \$650 to UMCOR for Ukrainian refugee support. We have had \$23,000 in expenses for the first three months of 2022. This means we will need to spend the entire 2022 budget to meet our expenses.

<u>Finance Report:</u> A Finance Meeting needs to be set up. We need to order supplies for the meatball dinner in September because of supply delays.

Pastors Report: Bible Study is going well. The Ash Wednesday service went well. On Palm Sunday there will be palms. The Easter Offering will go to the Damiano Center. Day camp will not be at the Boy Scout camp this summer. It will be at the Coppertop mornings and in the afternoons, there will be outings. The Annual Conference will be at St. Cloud on May 25-26. LeRoy Britton and Pastor Cynthia will be attending. Pastor Cynthia would like to have barbeques after church in July. We will send postcards to the neighbors inviting them. Copper Top has a bounce house that we will ask to borrow. The barbeques will be four Sundays after the 4th of July weekend – July 10,17,24 and 31. A motion was made by LeRoy and 2nd by Dave that we have barbecues on the four Sundays in July beginning July 10. Motion carried. She is thinking of having a garden in our grassy area to grow some vegetables. Cons are not enough sunny areas, cost and possible vandalism. During Sunday worships she would like us to volunteer to tell our faith story. Ron Scott is at the Aftenro home now and would like to come to church sometimes. We need to have someone to volunteer to pick him up and bring him back. Pastor Cynthia will be on vacation from April 23-30. We will have a service the Conference has made on April 24th and LeRoy Britton, Lay Leader will give the sermon on May 1st. Pastor Jeanine will be on call during her vacation.

<u>Lay Leader:</u> LeRoy continues to meet online with other lay leaders in the state. This coming Thursday is the next meeting. We are getting a few new people at church on Sundays.

SPRC: Nothing new to report on. Things are going smooth and well.

<u>Trustees:</u> We had the snow removed from the parking lot. It will cost between \$1,000-\$1200. The city had contacted us and we need to remove the snow on the Piedmont sidewalk. Bill took the CHUM food to the downtown location this time but it is too hard to find parking. The West Duluth location has closed. He looked into taking the food to the 2nd Harvest Food Shelf in air park. They will come and unload the food from the car so we decided to use 2nd Harvest Food Shelf in the future. The red front doors need painting. The windows need to be washed. They haven't been washed in quite a while. The top ones are too hard for us to do. If anyone needs any small 3 ring binders, we have quite a few that aren't needed. The two green plants don't get watered regularly and didn't look good. They have been replaced with artificial ones. The wall at the top of the stairs is cracked and needs fixing.

<u>Mission:</u> A meal will be made and delivered to Loaves & Fishes the second Tuesday of April. A list is on the bulletin board downstairs for people to sign up to bring food needed to make the meal.

<u>Other:</u> We have started coffee time again before church. People need to sign up to make the coffee, bring a store bought treat and clean up after church. There is a problem that not all people have a key to the church to get in early to make the coffee. We will meet after church this Sunday for planning the meatball dinner. The next meeting will beMay 3rd at 7:00. Pastor Cynthia gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned.
