Pastor's Ponderings... The Lord's Prayer

"After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen. " Matthew 6:9-13. King James Version

Many of us know the Lord's Prayer by heart. How did you first learn it? We pray it every Sunday at church. We remember it as the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples. But do we really understand and appreciate the meaning and power of its words, what we ask of God each time we pray it? Do we think about what we are saying/praying? Do we really mean it?



When the disciples asked Jesus how to pray, Jesus gave them this prayer. It is found in the gospels of Matthew and Luke. What are the differences/similarities and what significance, if any, do we find? Jesus likely taught this prayer to his followers often, not just one time. He never intended the Lord's Prayer to be a museum piece, framed and placed on a mantel or in a display case. It was Jesus, teaching God's people, through his disciples, how to pray.

In the book, "The Lord's Prayer: The Meaning and Power of the Prayer Jesus Taught," United Methodist pastor and author Adam Hamilton guides us in studying this prayer more deeply. I am so excited to lead a six-week study on this prayer, along with a sermon series beginning this September. (See the article in this newsletter with more info on the study.) I hope and pray that these next weeks will give us all a deeper understanding of the prayer and find it more meaningful in our own prayer life.

Basil from Church Garden: Two Suggested Recipes for Its Use

With an ample growth of basil in the Hillside Church garden, we are taking the opportunity to share some recipes for using this fragrant herb. The two recipes were provided by church member Karen Bailey, who said her family has enjoyed these uses of basil for many years.

Bruschetta

- 8 slices thick Italian bread
- Olive oil as needed
- Salt and pepper
- 10 to 20 leaves fresh basil
- Parmesan cheese

Turn on broiler with rack about 4 inches below heat. You can also use a toaster oven. Brush bread with olive oil on both sides. Sprinkle generously with Parmesan. Salt and pepper to taste. Place bread on oven proof sheet and bake until bread is crispy and cheese is melted. Remove bread from oven and place 1 or 2 basil leaves on each slice before eating. Enjoy!

Basil vinaigrette

- 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup chopped seeded fresh tomato
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh basil
- 1 teaspoon honey or sugar
- 1 shallot, cut into chunks (optional)
- Salt and pepper

Put all ingredients in a jar, seal it with a tight fitting lid, and shake vigorously. Adjust seasoning as needed. Shake the dressing again just before serving. Use on green chopped salad, cucumbers, sliced tomatoes or anything you would use salad dressing on.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The June Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Pastor Cynthia that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report was reviewed.

Finance Report: They will meet August 21st after church to plan Stewardship and Commitment Sunday.

Pastors Report: The Day Camp was July 18-22nd. There were 19 kids from 4 churches. It was a great week. Since Christmas Day falls on a Sunday this year we will have our Christmas Eve Service and there will be no church on Sunday, Christmas Day. Bible Study will begin on September 20th. It will be a 6-week series on the book "The Lord's Prayer". Pastor Cynthia had a one-on-one meeting with the District Superintendent in June. She suggested we have a purpose for the Dan Holte money, not only using it to supplement money we are short in our general budget. Mission or outreach were suggested. Pastor Cynthia will be subbing in the Duluth Public Schools this year. She will substitute at Piedmont and Laura MacArthur. She only would like 1 or 2 days a week. She won't be a long-term substitute.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: Nothing new to report on. The janitors will continue this year.

Trustees: The Duluth Fire Dept. has made their annual inspection and after replacing a couple lights we passed inspection. The insurance company we have through the United Methodist Insurance Program has ended and we will have to meet to decide what insurance company we will go with when it expires. The United Methodist Church has ended its sponsorship with the Boy Scouts of America. It still encourages churches to furnish meeting places and work with the youth. They will have to find a new sponsor for their troop. Carol made the motion that we continue to furnish a meeting place for the Cub Scout Pack 29, seconded by Diane. Motion approved. A card table is missing from the storage room. Does anyone know where it is.

Lamplighters: Carole and Carolyn visited Shirley Olson last week and will visit Bea Jacobson tomorrow.

Mission: A dinner was made and sent to Loaves & Fishes today. There won't be a signup sheet for donations for September. The meatball dinner will be the day before and we hope there will be some meatballs and food left over to send to Loaves & Fishes. If not, we have enough money to buy some frozen Lasagna for them. We will again collect warm clothes and hats & mittens for the homeless and needy people this year.

Worship: The hymn sings will end in August. It is nice that Pastor Jeanine and Pastor Cynthia can fill in for each other when they take a day off.

Meatball Dinner Update: There was a meeting today. Tickets will be mailed out August 26th to the congregation.
