The need is especially great now. On June 1 for the very first time since the start of the pandemic, the CHUM Food Shelf found it neces-



sary to limit the amount of food clients were able to take home to their families. Since March, CHUM has received 8,000 fewer pounds of food than during the same time in 2021, yet we have served more than 500 new individuals. Some items that are in low supply and are especially helpful: peanut butter, soups (especially chunky, more filling types), macaroni & cheese, pastas and sauces, canned ravioli & others.



Current Hillside UMC Covid Policy

Your Ad Council takes into consideration the case rate in St. Louis County, the Bishop's recommendation, and the CDC and the MDH recommendations. Here is the current plan:

- Masks are strongly encouraged but not required on Sunday mornings.
- Masks are available at the back foyer or the lower main entry. Coffee and goodies will be available before worship in the fellowship hall at 10:30 AM.
- Children's staff will continue to wear masks and sanitize all toys and play area.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The May Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by LeRoy that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's report was reviewed. Jim was not present tonight to answer any questions.

Finance Report: There was nothing to report on. The Meatball dinner containers have been purchased and are stored in the church.

Pastors Report: Ace is going on the Mission Trip and has sold 10 shares to help pay for the trip on July 21st. A big thank you to Pastor Nicole and the others in our church who helped out while Pastor Cynthia was ill with Covid. The Day Camp is July 18-22. One afternoon the kids will go to the Cloquet Pinehurst swimming area. There are 15 kids registered so far. The Annual Conference was May 25th and 26th. The UMC softball team has been cancelled because there are not enough people interested in being on the team. Pastor Cynthia is going to the United Church of Christ for their Conference on June 9-11. Thursday will be Boundary Training. Friday and Saturday will be the Conference. She is an ordained United Church of Christ Pastor.

Lay Leader: LeRoy met with all the Lay Leaders in the state again. The Annual Conference will be June 20th next year. We are looking for people to help with the BBQs in July. LeRoy and Jim will be the cooks. One raised bed garden has been planted in the church yard.

SPRC: No report.
