Pastor's Ponderings... R.A.K.

"With what should I approach the Lord and bow down before God on high? He has told you, human one, what is good and what the Lord requires from you: to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God." – Micah 6:6,8

What if we lived in a world where kindness was the norm? Some folks worldwide are asking the same question. There is a kindness movement happening. R.A.K. Random Acts of Kindness. It's been around for a while now. It's not new. And actually, the scripture verse from Micah comes to us from the 8th century BCE. Kindness is not new, but



apparently, we need constant reminders to be kind. It's something that every religion can get behind, every government, every country, every town, every church, every synagogue, every mosque, every human being.

Hillside folks are kind. That is one of our greatest strengths. Let's continue to bring that kindness out into the community and not save it all for each other. Here are some suggestions for RAK. Small acts of kindness can have big impacts. Not everyone can do everything on this list. We all have our gifts and abilities. Pick one, or two; and make up your own. Do something you don't normally do. And tell me about it! Send me an email, or call me, or stop me on a Sunday morning, or invite me over for tea and tell me about your RAKs.

Donate clothes to shelters in your city. Cheerfully greet someone in the elevator. Shovel snow in a neighborhood. Let someone ahead of you in the checkout line. Hide encouraging notes at home, at work, at school, or church. Call your parents just to talk. Build a birdhouse for your local birdwatchers. Take your siblings out for ice cream. Mail out a thank you letter. Pick up litter along the road. Leave spare change at the laundromat. Email an under-appreciated co-worker. Take care of yourself with mental breaks. Leave a positive comment on blogs and Facebook. Leave a large tip for a struggling waiter. Pay for the person's food behind you in the drive through. Run errands for busy family members. Make an effort to learn others' names. Offer to pet sit for vacationing friends. Keep an extra umbrella around for others. Pick up a friend for church. Just be present and listen to each other.



All Church Charge Conference, January 15, 2023 Presiding Elder, Pastor Nicole Anderson

Pastor Cynthia Coffin-Langdon opened the meeting with a prayer. Then she turned the meeting over to Presiding Elder, Pastor Nicole Anderson.

The Pastoral Compensation Package was shown to the congregation. No motion was needed to accept the Pastoral Compensation Package. It was approved on December 6, 2022. The total for 2023 is \$38,277.14.

Jim Leland, Treasurer, presented the financial position of the church. In 2022 we received income of \$76,398. Our actual expenses were \$93,944.72. The shortfall was covered by the bequests in our bank account. The anticipated income for 2023 is \$67,840. The 2023 Budget for the church is \$98,134.14. Any shortfall will be taken from the bequests in our bank account. The congregation unanimously approved the Budget.

The Church Leadership Committee members were presented by Pastor Cynthia. The Mission and Education chair positions remain open. She asked if anyone would like to fill one of them. There were no volunteers. A motion was made by Carolyn Dahl and seconded by Carole Hawkinson to accept the members on the Committees. Motion unanimously approved. Pastor Nicole Anderson said a prayer for those on the Committees.

The Inactive/ Unresponsive Members report was reviewed by Pastor Cynthia. On the two-year list of inactive/unresponsive members ten people were removed from membership list. Two people wish to remain as constituent members, not official members. A motion was made by Sandy Wilmot and seconded by LeRoy Britton to remove the ten members on the two-year list. Motion unanimously approved. Pastor Cynthia said there will be a membership meeting in February for any new people wanting to become members of our church. Pastor Nicole Anderson said a prayer for those on the Inactive/Unresponsive list. The congregation was given an opportunity to celebrate what they liked about Hillside UMC. The Meatball Dinner, an Opportunity to Celebrate, the Mission trip for Ace, new faces, a new person felt very welcomed, the many donations on the CHUM food shelf table, having a building to come to, preparing, donations and delivering a meal for Loaves & Fishes each month, weekly Bible Study, Emma, our accompanist, the Board of Trustees who are right there when needed.

Presiding Elder Nicole Anderson gave the closing prayer. Meeting adjourned.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The December Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> We spent \$93,944 in 2022 which makes us \$800 over our budget of \$93,140. The offering in 2022 which includes envelope and miscellaneous giving amounted to \$71,475. This was \$22,500 less than was needed to pay the bills.

<u>Finance Report</u>: We have \$34,300 pledged for the 2023 Budget. The Budget for 2023 will be around \$97,000. A number of people give to the church but don't pledge.

Pastors Report: December was a busy month. The Christmas Eve service was great. 91 people were in attendance. It was nice to see the church this filled. Bill Schilling's funeral service will be this coming Saturday January 7th.

Lay Leader: No Report.

SPRC: The extra \$75 bonus for the staff was handed out at the Christmas Eve service. We need to change the janitors name for the payroll. It is still in her sister's name.

Trustees: The Cub Scouts have found a new home at Salem Lutheran Church.

Lamplighters: Don Harris is at Lakeshore for rehab after breaking his hip.

<u>Missions:</u> There are no new projects. Loaves & Fishes had someone with COVID last month. We will check to see if everyone is well now.

Worship: Ash Wednesday is February 22nd. Easter is April 9th. We need to schedule a new member day to see if any of our new attendees would like to join the church. We know of five people who are coming to church on Sundays.

<u>Other:</u> The forms need to be filled out for the Church Conference packet. We also need an Elder to take charge of the All-Church Charge Conference after the Church service on February 15th. We need to buy potatoes for the Potato Extravaganza on February 15th after the Conference. The next meeting is February 7th at 7PM.

Pastor Cynthia gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
