"Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. Matthew 6:2

On the youth summer mission trip, we got to do a lot of giving. We cooked and served lunch at the Simpson House shelter. We removed loads and loads (and more loads) of garbage from the old shelter that is going to be demolished to build a new shelter. We packed more than 2,000 bags of food for children in Haiti. CHUM Rhubarb Festival

This year's Rhubarb Festival was great success. The morning of the festival, \$15,000 of food was sold by 10:30 AM. The festival also brought in nearly \$7,000 on donated baskets, which exceeded their \$5,000 goal. Hillside UMC's basket was one of the top 3 in the basket sales. On another note, CHUM sent thank you letters Hillside UMC for \$100 donations dated May 8 and June 2.



For the Dorothy Day House on June 13, we made beef stew. Five pounds of stew meat was donated by Upper Lakes Foods. We also had a large package of cut up potatoes donated. We browned the stew meat and added two cans of french onion soup to the meat. Then we topped that with frozen carrots and frozen peas, adding beef broth and cooking for two hours. Along with the stew, we made pineapple coleslaw and also sent two dozen dinner rolls. For dessert, we delivered a gallon of ice cream, and Mardi Rodman made seven layer bars. This month we sent the always needed extras: paper towels, dish soap, laundry soap and all-purpose cleaner. The men at the Dorothy Day house are well taken care of on the second Tuesday of each month by Hillside United Methodist Church, and they are always waiting for Cliff & Diane Boris to drive up to their front door and are willing to carry the food in the house. They appreciate very much the mission work we do. Thanks to everyone who helps make this possible by donating money, time and prayers.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The Ad Council minutes for May were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The treasurer's report was reviewed. The Love Offering was \$225. This was brought to the Annual Conference by Pastor Cynthia. The plants were paid for by the UMW budget. Loaves and Fishes have \$243 left to buy food to provide meals.

Finance Report: Giving is going down each month. In May the budget was short \$2,300. We plan to have another meatball dinner in September.

Pastors Report: She has been very busy. The Annual Conference was great. Ace plans to go on the Mission trip June 13-15. Pastor Cynthia needs to go to the United Church of Christ conference June 8-9. She was ordained by the United Church of Christ. We

would like to have Vacation Bible School July 17-21. There are 6-7 kids signed up now. We will have to see if more sign up by July. Pastor Cynthia is Resigning from Coppertop Church. Her last Sunday will be in July.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: No report. Karen Bailey has resigned from co-chairman of SPRC.

Trustees: The ping pong table and blackboard still need a home. We will see if a youth center is interested in having these items. The inspection is completed on the elevator. The custodian would like more hours now that school is out. Tables and Chairs need to be washed and it is done outside. Plants need watering, the grass needs cutting. We could offer the custodian 4 hours more per pay period.

<u>Lamplighters:</u> They haven't done much calling lately. Barb Kent is not doing well. They will see Beatrice this week.

<u>Missions:</u> The Loaves & Fishes is going well.

Worship: Funerals go well. The report on the Conference was a very good one. We discussed having a mid-week service during the summer. Our 100th Anniversary celebration will be this fall. The Bishop can't come and the District Superintendent is checking her calendar. They both have busy schedules. We would like to have a dinner or luncheon after church on the 100th anniversary celebration day. The flag in the yard has been torn by the weather and repaired too many times. A new flag has been donated and will be put up soon. Phyllis and Warren are having a social gathering at their house later in June. Cindy Guiliani would like to have a social gathering at her house too.

Other: The next meeting will be July 11th at 7PM.

Pastor Cynthia gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
