Pastor's Message Howdy Hillside!




Hillside UMC Book Club

Finance Report: No report.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> She enjoyed her family vacation. She and JoJo were honored following worship two weeks ago following worship at Copper Top. People expressed their thanks for the service of the two of them. Pastor Cynthia let us know that this is a very emotional time for her, too and leaving is difficult. We had a nice gathering at Britton's for our July get-together. The August gathering will be at Cindy Giuliani's house on Tuesday, August 22nd.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: There was a meeting last night with the District Superintendent. Our new pastor will be Jeremy Woodley. He is from Texas and has served two congregations there. His wife has been given a job at UWS. That's what brings them up to our area. He has a family of 4 children ages 8 to 15. He will start the first Sunday in September. He is hired as a half time position with the salary remaining the same. We have applied for a \$4,000-5,000 grant from the Conference through MN Builders to pay for having the doors painted and the roof leak fixed. We have not heard yet is we will receive the grant. We want to change the time of the service beginning September 1. A motion was made by Sandy and seconded by Carole that we start the service at 10:15 AM beginning in September. All approved. Motion passed. Phyllis and Warren will continue to change the sign outside but need help knowing what to say on it.

Trustees: Carole met with Kiki Langdon/Larson regarding the work we would like accomplished during the extra hours we have given her for the summer. She will continue to stay on as the janitor for one more year. We still haven't found the lost card table. If anyone has it, please bring it back to the church, no questions asked. A new security camera has been installed in the storage room downstairs and a warning sign put up by the

garbage and recycling bin to try to ward off people who think our containers are for public use. Russ Lindgren monitors the cameras. We have discovered the control unit for the heat tape over the addition was not working this past winter that caused the ice buildup and a leak in our newly repaired wall. We have replaced the control and hopefully that will fix the problem. We are asking the wall repair person if he can repair the wall at the top of the stairs before our 100th anniversary celebration.

Lamplighters: They had a visit with Beatrice and Shirley. Pastor Cynthia and Carolyn will ask Shirley what she remembers about our church in the past for our 100th anniversary.

<u>Missions:</u> Jim brings the food to CHUM every month. We brought a meal to Loaves & Fishes today. We are collecting school supplies to bring to Piedmont Elementary school.

Worship: Kelby gave the service the two Sundays while Pastor Cynthia was on vacation.

Other: We have invited our past Pastors to our 100th Anniversary in October. Several have said they would like to come. The new Church Directory is done. Jeannette did a nice job putting it together. There will be a catered luncheon after church for the 100th anniversary celebration. We need people to sign up to do jobs for the meatball dinner. Please sign up for two jobs if possible. The next meeting will be September 5th at 7PM.
