Zoom Administrative Council Meetings – Sept. 5, 2023

Attendance: Diane Boris, Carolyn Dahl, Carole Hawkinson, Pastor Jeremy, Jim Leland, Dave McKowski

Carolyn opened the meeting with a prayer.

The August Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed. We have been withholding 23% of our dues to the Conference. This amounts to \$10,629.90 as of this date. We are waiting until the next General Conference to see which way the Methodist Church is going. The August giving was \$50,318, expenses were \$63,259. Which means we were short \$13,942 to pay our bills.

Finance Report: We decided the Thanksgiving offering will go to the Union Gospel Mission, the Christmas offering to Salvation Army heat share, and the Easter offering to the Damiano center for CHUM. The Motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that this is where our Thanksgiving, Christmas & Easter offerings will go. Motion Approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jeremy is just beginning to serve our church. He has a medical issue that needs to be taken care of and he may miss a few Sundays with us. He can't set up a time for Bible Study yet.

Lay Leader: No report.

**SPRC:** Sandy & Carole met with Pastor Jeremy and got all the paperwork done. They gave him a tour of the church and gave him a key to the church.

Trustees: The wall by the back stairs has been repaired again. The front doors have been repainted and clear-coated at a cost of \$800. Wayne and Russ reinstalled the doors. The locks got put in sideways and a locksmith had to be called to fix that and replace some worn parts. Cost was \$90. Arrow Lift did their semi-annual maintenance on the lift and the time limit on the batteries is up and they need to be replaced. They will also do a full-load test on the lift. Their cost will be \$822 and the work will be done this month. Some of the groundlevel cement blocks around the memorial garden are deteriorating because of salt over the years. We won't be doing

something about this at this time. Peterson Landscaping will do our snowplowing and snow removal again this year.

**Lamplighters:** Bea & Shirley are the only ones that like to be seen but they haven't been visited this past month.

**Missions:** Jim brings the food to CHUM every month. Loaves & Fishes is going well. We hope to have leftovers from the Meatball dinner to bring them for their September meal.

Other: We have invited our past Pastors to our 100th Anniversary in October. Pastors Karen Schuder and Cynthia will attend. A couple can't be there but will make a video to be shown at the Anniversary. The superintendent will do the sermon. There will be a catered luncheon after church for the 100th anniversary celebration. We still need some help for the meatball dinner. Please sign up for two jobs if possible. The next meeting will be October 3rd at 7PM.

Pastor Jeremy gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
