Greetings friends,

It occasionally happens that a hymn or song gets so associated with a thing that without that song, the THING doesn't work. Have you ever been to a wedding where the traditional 'bridal march'



wasn't used? Did it make the wedding seem less official? For those events and many more, we associate music with what's happening; without it, it can feel like we didn't do it right.

Nov. 5 is All Saints' Sunday. One hymn that has been long associated with this day is, "His Eye is on the Sparrow." This hymn has become closely associated with saying goodbye to people we love. If you look at the bottom of the page in our hymnal you see the song is based on John 14 and Luke 12. John 14:1-3, "Jesus speaking to his friends: 'Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me. My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.'

What a wonderful promise; it blesses us with hope of continued life with Jesus! Is there any better place, than being where Jesus is? This is a wonderful truth, but it is also true that we grieve the loss of those we love. An interesting thing about "His Eye is on the Sparrow" is that it was written for us; the living, not the dead. It reminds us that as we live with grief, we are not unseen. Even if we hide it really deep, where people may not see it... Jesus sees it. It is in drawing nearer to Jesus that hope returns because then we hear again how much he loves us.

Grand 100th Anniversary Celebration at Hillside UMC

Nearly 70 present and past members and friends gathered for the 100th anniversary of Hillside United Methodist Church Sunday, Oct. 8. The event was superbly chronicled by television journalist William Lien in the lead story appearing on the Sunday, Oct. 8, WDIO television evening news.

During her sermon, Rev. Laurie Kantonen, our District Superintendent, praised our 100 years of service and challenged us to be open to new ways of doing church to serve our community. Former HUMC pastor Rev. Cynthia Coffin-Langdon, emphasized in the children's message what great things can come from meeting in a chicken coop. As the legend goes, our forebearers first met in a chicken coop for prayer and bible study before they met in Frank Johnson's house in 1923 for a more formalized Sunday school. The children were given squeaky toy chickens to celebrate our 100th.


The action continued during lunch in The Fellowship Hall. We played video interviews with former pastors Rev. David Wheeler (1987-1995), Rev. Dr. Karen Schuder (1993-2011), Rev. Sam Kautz (2011-2017), and Rev. Elizabeth Macaulay (1996-1998). Pastor Wheeler said that we were a people of faith, service and commitment, praising Ellen Olson, Emma Tallakson, Joe & Liz Gomer, John

The taped interviews also included Virginia "Ginny" Tibodeau, 93, Hillside's, longest member, and Shirley Olson, 94, Hillside UMC's oldest member. Ginny has attended our church since she was age 5. She particularly remembered beloved Sunday School teacher Mrs. Seymour who would routinely ask Ginny, "Have you said your prayers every night?" Shirley was married in 1947 and had her wedding reception at what was then Christ Community Church. Her wedding was at First UMC because our church at that time was a basement with a cap on top and wasn't as conducive to a wedding. She says that the people here are so caring and she

Thanksgiving Offering to UGM Aids Duluth's Food-Challenged

Every year we take a special Thanksgiving offering in November. This year our offering will be given to Union Gospel Mission to support their ministry. Please bring or mail in your offering to church by Sunday, Nov. 19.



Union Gospel Mission offers a hot meal ministry for lunches and dinners for those in need. The Mission currently distributes over 5,000 nutritious meals each month. Many of the Mission's patrons come from food-challenged households. The majority of these households include children or seniors on limited incomes. Guests often rely on the meals, and groceries, distributed at the Mission to meet their nutritional needs.

In addition to the meal program, UGM operates the Martin Inn, located upstairs of the dining hall. The Martin Inn provides low-income, community housing to people of all different backgrounds. Upon arrival, residents are provided with a warm bed, stocked kitchen, and free laundry.

The Mission provides a host of additional supportive resources. Children, seniors and families visit the Mission each day to access warm clothing, personal hygiene essentials or spiritual support.

UGM always seeks volunteers and food donations, too. Thank you for being generous!

Food & Shelter a Priority

Many Chum volunteers give their time and energy to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless. Over the past 10 years, there has been a 157 percent increase in chronic homelessness coupled with disability (often mental illness



or substance use disorder). So far in 2023, 53 homeless persons have died in Duluth. Safe Bay parking space in Duluth is due to close in November, so the need for winter-safe shelter space will increase for the 188 individuals living in their vehicles.

The September Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Jim that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> The treasurer's report was reviewed.

<u>Finance Report:</u> Stewardship is coming up. Dedication Sunday will be November 19th. A letter, pledge card & envelope will be sent out by the 29th of October. A few words on stewardship will be said by Dave during the church services of November 5th and 12th.

<u>Pastor's Report:</u> An Annual Conference will be held on ZOOM November 13th. Church affiliations expire on December 31. Only the clergy and lay leaders can vote.

<u>Lay Leader:</u> No report.

Missions: A heavy box of Food was brought to the Chum Food Shelf. We are collecting warm clothes, blankets, sleeping bags, mittens, hats, sweaters and jackets for the United Gospel Mission for the cold weather.

Other: We are working on our 100th Anniversary celebration. Emma will not be able to be at the service on October 22^{nd.} Pastor Jeremy will call around to find an accompanist that day. Our Ad Council meetings are changing to mornings. The next meeting will be November 1 at 10:30 AM.

Pastor Jeremy gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
