us. Those are fun lists because they make us feel good, thinking of all the good things about the past year. On the other hand, no one makes a 'worsts' list. The New Year is a chance to sweep our worst moments away and look toward the future. It seems like that is the usual fuel for the next most popular thing in the new year: Resolutions. Resolutions are pretty simple; we don't think we did well enough at something last year, and now we will fix it.

When we put those two kinds of lists together we get: Looking back at the *Positive* and looking forward to the *Positive*. However, as followers of Jesus we need to take a minute and acknowledge the negative so we can move into the new year without bringing any baggage with us. How do we do that? *REPENTANCE*. This is the first step for anyone who makes a commitment to follow Jesus. In Matthew 3, John the Baptist is living into his name, "People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River." John knew this wasn't enough. This confession and repentance wasn't going to enable these people to follow through with their own resolutions to follow God more closely so he said, "I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit".

As you reflect on your relationship with Jesus over the past year, I pray you will look at the difficult areas where repentance is needed and then project into the new year with renewed determination to follow Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit, that is where the real JOY is!


your name. We will furnish the potatoes and bake them while we are worshipping!

Chum Offers Impressive Services

Food Distribution Services: With two emergency food shelf locations in Duluth, MN, Chum delivered over 500,000 pounds of food to those in need in 2022. This



program also delivers food to those who cannot get to our locations.

Shelter: Chum's Stabilization Services include the emergency shelter program for families and individuals, homeless street outreach, the Chum Drop-In Center, the Chum Clinic, family and individual case management, employment services, and benefits advocacy.

Housing Services: Chum offers those escaping trauma and crisis a roof over their heads and a place of their own. Chum helps families at the Steve O'Neil Apartments break cycles of homelessness. At the St. Francis Apartments, Chum provides a safe place for seniors to create a home and accomplish their goals.



Congregational Outreach, Advocacy, and Organizing:

Forty Duluth area congregations reach out, advocate, and organize for justice for those in need.

Chum Works Hard to Bring Warmth & Services to Homeless

November brought a notable increase in Warming Center guests, averaging 59 individuals each night – a significant rise compared to the previous year. The trend has continued into December, with nightly numbers surpassing 70 or more.

To address health concerns, Lake Superior Community Health Center and the University of Minnesota Mobile Clinic have been offering clinic hours while the Warming Center is open. St. Louis County Public Health nurses have initiated monthly COVID and flu vaccine clinics. Despite these efforts, capacity challenges loom on the horizon.

This year has witnessed 25 unaccompanied youth (under 24 years old), including two 18-year-olds seeking shelter. Chum's Stepping On Up intern is dedicated to this demographic, fostering relationships with youth-serving agencies to expedite their transition to more suitable shelter and housing options.

A commendable team of volunteers raised over \$1800, earmarked for essential supplies like new sleeping mats. Their contributions have been immensely valued. Chum's staff is fully equipped and has a new site coordinator who transitioned in that role from her previous role as the shelter's wellness coordinator.
