I hope you continue to press into this season of fasting because it will make the upcoming season of feasting that much more enriching. Celebrating Easter and the resurrection of Jesus Christ is infinitely more glorious if we have done the hard work of recognizing just how much we need a Savior!

Needed: Food Shelf Donations

Minnesota's March FoodShare Campaign began on Feb.26 and will continue until April 6. Hillside UMC has always been generous and CHUM is grateful for our donations.



The 2023 campaign raised \$91,630 and 69,188 pounds. This year's goal is to raise \$100,000 and 50,000 pounds of food to stock CHUM's shelves

During 2023, the Food Shelf distributed 533,152 pounds of food to 15,781 people in Duluth.

So what is needed?? More money, or more food?? Although both are needed, the Food Shelf can do much more with money. For every \$1 that gets donated, Chum can buy \$3 worth of food.

Although all items are needed, Chum especially needs items like:

- Peanut butter (Small Jars-16oz)
- Canned soup (Non Cream)
- Canned fruit
- Canned vegetables
- Canned stew and Canned Pasta
- Canned fish
- Canned beans
- Pasta
- Rice
- Cereal
- Spaghetti Sauce

A general tip: When possible, choose containers other than glass due to the possibility of breakage during storage and transport.



Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The January Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed.

Finance Report: The Easter Offering will go to the Damiano Center.

<u>Pastors Report</u>: He is putting together the reports that need to go to the Conference. They are numbers about how many members we have, how many died last year, how many we serve with missions, etc. We will be giving one third grader a bible this year. Our Superintendent will be having surgery. Pastor will be going to Texas in March.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: We have hired two new people to fill the Administrative Assistant position and the Janitor Job. The Administrative Assistant will be training in February. Jeannette's last day is March 31. We need to have a volunteer to tend to the nursery when Brenna can't be there. However, we don't have any young children.

Trustees: Our insurance renews in March. Our deductible will be raised so the premium won't be as much as last year. We had an elevator inspection. A timer has been put on the heat tape on the roof but as of right now we don't need the heat tape to be on at all. Our electric bill was quite a bit higher in January.

Lamplighters: Shirley Olson is still at Ecumen. She is working on getting stronger to be able to go back home. Bob Lyness and his wife went to a care center. Bea Jacobson was in church a couple weeks ago.

<u>Missions</u>: The food we collect is brought to the Chum Food Shelf each month. Loaves & Fishes is going well. A person looking to start up Habitat for Humanity was at church Sunday and asked Jim if we would be interested in working on getting this going again. Jim thought it was unlikely since we are an elderly congregation.

Worship: In Lent the Bible Study will be moving to noon on Tuesdays. People can bring a bag lunch. For Lent there will be daily devotionals available. We will sing Psalms to music we know. Palms will be bought for Palm Sunday. There will be an Easter Breakfast at 10:15 to 10:45 on Easter Sunday. The Pastor would like to have a State of the Church on a Sunday with a brunch. We talked about having a Sunday Service in the summer at a park like we used to do.

Other: We will be paying our annual fee to TPUMM. Our next meeting will be March 6.

Pastor Jeremy gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adjourned.
