When it comes to Easter, we have the entire season of Lent that builds up the importance and impact of Easter. Good parties have a reason to celebrate, like graduation, a wedding, or a birthday. With Easter we have the ultimate reason for celebration, Jesus' victory over sin and death and our own invitation to receive this victory as a gift of grace.
