Alongside all of this, delegates to the conference worshipped together and were challenged to continue to seek out the ways God is at work in our communities and beyond. Surprisingly, (ok it isn't surprising) everyone didn't agree 100% on how best to move forward. For a lot of folks that seems like a negative; but I am not so sure it is. Our differences of opinion challenge us to reconsider and look more closely at what we have determined to be our best way forward. The connection we belong to as part of a denomination that is represented around the world serves to broaden our vision of Jesus Christ's mission. A big part of that mission is the unity of all followers of Jesus. It is so important that he prays for us this way in John 17, "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you... I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity." This seems impossible with all the things that continue to divide us but I will never call impossible what Jesus specifically prays for. How do we achieve this unity then? It is the "I in them" part that makes it work. Our responsibility is to allow Jesus to be in control over ALL aspects of our life and to, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment" (Matt. 22:37-38). Let's try it out together!

Administrative Council Meeting - April 3, 2024

Those in attendance: Carolyn Dahl-Chair, Carole Hawkinson, Jim Leland, Dave McKowski, Sandy Wilmot, Pastor Jeremy Woodley.

Carolyn opened our meeting with prayer and called for acceptance of the minutes from our meeting on April 3, 2024. MSC (Carole/Sandy) that the minutes be accepted with one change: the reference to LeRoy Britton as our representative to Annual Conference was changed to reflect that is our Lay Delegate to Conference.

Jim presented the Treasurer's report and it has been filed for audit.

Dave reported that new wicks have successfully been installed in the oil candles and Jim will check to see when we last ordered the oil.

Pastor Jeremy has registered both himself and LeRoy Britton for Annual Conference the end of May and is working to get Kathy Gajewski registered as an equalization member. TPUMM is contemplating putting out yard signs saying something like "Do No Harm" before the fall election. They are also considering a combined confirmation class.

Sandy reported that our staff is stable right now. It was suggested that we have an

District report for the District Superintendent. Carolyn will purchase a card to thank Kiki for her service as our custodian – she will be leaving for college in the fall. Hayes Woodley will take over her duties beginning the 1st of June.

Carole reported for the Board of Trustees that the lamp portion of our street light over the parking lot has blown down and has been reported to MPL. There is still a problem with water around one of the furnaces and Comfort Systems will again be called to find out why. Our maintenance contract with Arrow Lift has been renewed for the following year.

Our Lamplighters have visited with Shirley Olson, Bea Jacobson, Ron and Jan Mattson, MJ Kuhlmey and Bob Lyness, either in person or by phone.

For Missions. Jim has been taking our Food Shelf donations to the West Duluth receiving center. On Pentecost Sunday, May 19th, we will put an empty table in the sanctuary and have the children bring up the donations from the fellowship hall, as a way of emphasizing the need for giving. Loaves and Fishes is going well with the meat being donated most of the time. Sandy asked that we plan to participate in National Night Out on the 1st Tuesday in August, as another mission/ outreach project.

MSC (Sandy/Carole) to start using a large calendar for church activities and opportunities as an effort to upcoming events. Some of those (but not limited to) are National Night Out in August, our Swedish Meatball Dinner in September, Piedmont Back Pack items in September, Warm clothes and blankets for Union Gospel Mission in October, hats and mittens for Union Gospel Mission in November and toys for Union Gospel Mission in December. Pastor Jeremy will speak with Jerry McNeal re: the Piedmont back pack items.

Pastor Jeremy is planning a "State of the Church" service sometime after Pentecost. This will show us where we have been and where we going, out budget needs, bible study and discipleship pathways. He is also suggesting a bit different wording for our mission statement that isn't so long. The banner that asks "carry my cross" should be edited to say "carry your cross".

Some congregational fellowship ideas are: potato extravaganza and potluck salad luncheon.

The annual Love Offering will be taken on the next two Sundays and then taken to Conference the end of the month.
