However, there are a lot of people who are very interested in politics With Jesus, the purpose of a debate wasn't to win, it was to elicit truth.

and particularly the largest campaigns that we have, the race for the presidency. On our street we already have signs posted in yards that are in conflict over who should be elected president in November. The difference in opinion is expected and opens up the opportunity for debating the merits of each candidate. It would be great if that was the message those signs relay but instead they are mostly denigrating the opposing candidate. This topic came up at the last Twin Ports United Methodist Missions (TPUMMS) meeting. One of the pastors at the meeting came up with a plan to help combat the negative messaging that we see around us by making some yard signs of our own; signs with a message of "Multiplying Love." We are currently in the design process for our signs so we will let you know about availability when they are ready. Election seasons provide the followers of Jesus with an opportunity. Not an opportunity to seize political power or dictate the passing of laws but to show the world we live in what it looks like to be governed by our Lord and Savior Jesus. Jesus loved a good debate, he did it all the time and he also had an undefeated record (see Luke 20 and Matthew 22). However, with Jesus, the purpose of a debate wasn't to win, it was to elicit truth. Truth about himself, the law, and living rightly in the world. In this season I hope we can debate like Jesus, not to win but to find the truth we need to live by and the love to commit to this life.

To make the Alfredo dish, we cooked the skinless, boneless chicken, then cut it into bite size pieces. We cooked noodles, made Alfredo sauce, and mixed it all together. Then we put it into a large steam-table pan. We also heated up a large can of corn for their vegetable. The salad was a large green salad with sliced cucumbers and cherry tomatoes on top. We made two bunt cakes for dessert. Mint chocolate chip ice cream went along with that. Milk, rolls, butter, and ranch dressing were also included. The extras this month were toilet paper, toilet bowl cleaner, and disinfecting wipes.

Carolyn gave the opening prayer.

The May Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Carolyn that the minutes be approved. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed. \$260 was given for Love Offering. It was brought to the Conference by LeRoy Britton.

Finance Report: No report. There was some discussion on how to handle the stewardship this fall.

Pastors Report: Pastor Jeremy and LeRoy Britton attended the Conference the end of May. One item from the Conference was Redistricting. They are going to cut the district to four instead of five. They are trying to even it out so each district will have a larger city and rural areas.

Lay Leader: No report.

SPRC: Kiki is done with her janitor job in the church. Hayes will start as janitor this week.

Trustees: In the furnace room the sump pump has been replaced and a faucet leak has been repaired. There is still water coming in the corner of the furnace room. Kiki finished ianitoring and we sent a thank you card to her for her 5 years of journed. keeping the church clean. Hayes Woodley will begin the position this week.

Lamplighters: Shirley Olson and Bea Jacobson will be visited today. Pastor Jeremy called the shut-ins. Rose Schilling died last Sunday,

June 2nd. Her obituary will be in the paper in January and there will be a memorial service for her then.

Missions: The Loaves & Fishes are going well. National Night Out will be August 6th. It is always the first Tuesday in August. Sandy and Wayne Wilmot agreed to be the co-chairmen of National Night Out.

Worship: Pastor Jeremy will be on vacation June 17-21. It was brought up about having a blessing of animals. No action was taken.

Other: We are wondering if the jail is going to ask for donations of cookies at Christmas time again this year. Our next meeting will be July 3, at 10:30 AM.

Pastor Jeremy gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adiourned
