We browned ground beef, added three cans of Cream of Mushroom soup, four pounds of frozen mixed vegetables, four pounds of tater tots, and topped it with three cans of cheddar cheese soup. The salad was made with dry orange Jello mixed in with Cool Whip. Then we added cottage cheese, mandarin oranges, and sliced pears. Two dozen dinner rolls were also included with this meal. Our next meeting will be August 7th, 2024.


Pastor Jeremy closed our meeting with a prayer.
