

Administrative Council Meeting - December 4, 2024

Hillside United Methodist Church Lay Leader: No report. Administrative Council Meeting December 3, 2024

Attendance: Diane Boris, Carolyn Dahl, Carole Hawkinson, Pastor Jeremy, Jim Leland, Sandy Wilmot, Dave McKowski

Carolyn gave the opening praver.

The November Ad Council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Carole and seconded by Dave that the minutes be approved. All approved.

Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report was reviewed. We looked at the Minnesota Paid Leave Program sheet. We have a couple employees who would qualify for the paid leave time off

Finance Report: Pledge cards we have received so far total \$29,040. We will have a church conference on January 19, 2025. The 2025 Budget should be done and approved by the Ad Council December 15th after church.

Pastors Report: Pastor Jeremy talked about his new Pastor assignment at Moose Lake UMC.

SPRC: It is suggested we give a raise to our employees. The accompanist would be paid \$150 a Sunday up from \$140. The hourly employee's salary would be raised one dollar per hour from \$18 per hour to \$19 per hour. A motion was made by Sandy and seconded by Carole that we give the employees a raise in 2025. accompanist from \$140 to \$150 and hourly employees \$18/hr. to \$19/hr. Motion approved. The Christmas bonuses for our employees will be handed out on Sunday, December 15th.

Trustees: A group of bridge card players would like to rent our building on Mondays for \$100 per week. They will use the building from 10:30 am to 3:30 pm each Monday They are unable to stay in the building they are playing in now. We need to look into this further before we can agree to this. We will be paying the Compensation Assisting the needy. Making for Pastor Jeremy for both Hillside UMC & Moose Lake UMC and Moose Lake UMC will be reimbursing us for their share. The Pastor Compensation package was revised when Pastor Jeremy began his Sunday Services at Moose Lake UMC.

Lamplighters: Violet Lyness was Admin Council Secretary visited at Bee Hive. Thet saw

the Mattson's at Edgewood. Shirley Olson will be visited shortly. They talked to MJ on the phone.

Missions: The last day to bring toys for the toy drive for United Gospel Mission is Sunday. The kids from the different Methodist churches that meet together handed out hot chocolate and cookies at Bentleyville as a mission project. The last day to bring cookies for the jail is December 15th.

Worship: The Advent greens were hung the Sunday December 1st. The projector got cleaned. The children are going to put on a program during the Sunday service on December 22nd.

Other: A new mission statement was written up. Instead of the current LAMP statement which was wordy, the new one will read – Living for Jesus. Disciples. Praising God together. The next meeting will be January 8th at 10:30 am.

Pastor Jeremy gave the closing prayer. The meeting was adiourned.
