Pastor's Message Greetings friends,

The beginning of every new year is a busy time. This new year has been even busier as we have gone through another election cycle in our country and we see daily changes taking place as we always do in these years. In the life of our church, we have prepared for and held our annual Charge Conference to take care of some of our official 'business' of the church. During it all, and under it all there is one thing that is constant in the midst of change (and no it isn't Methodist committee meetings). As followers of Jesus there is an unchanging foundation that we stand on: the Bible!

What verse will the Holy Spirit bring to you? There is only one way to find out: Ask.

I received a challenge from a daily devotional text that we have extended to our weekly Bible Study group here at Hillside. The challenge goes like this:

"Build your life on the one thing—the one thing that endures forever—the Word of God. It stands to reason that anything on that which endures forever will also endure forever. How does one build one's life on the one thing that endures forever—the Word of God? We have to get it out of the bindings of a book and into our lives. So how does one build one's life on the one thing that endures forever? One verse at a time. Start with a verse—a constellation of God-breathed words. Ask the Holy Spirit to highlight a verse."

I encourage you to make this a goal for 2025, to listen for the Holy Spirit to reveal a verse of the Bible that will carry you through this year. This will almost certainly mean spending time reading through your Bible. Giving it time to speak to you. For me, the verse of the year is Psalm 46:10, "He says, 'Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." What verse will the Holy Spirit bring to you? There is only one way to find out: Ask.




