Pastor's Message

The 171st session of the Minnesota Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church will take place June 11-13. Think of everything that has gone into getting the Conference to this point, as countless changes have occurred in the church, in our state, nation, and around the world. Our annual gathering of the Methodists of Minnesota has sought to address the world we live in and all of its changes through the inspiration of Jesus Christ. This year the theme of the Annual Conference is, "Created to Love Boldly," based on 1 John 4. John Wesley's favorite chapter in all scripture was 1 John 4, and when we read his, "Notes on the New Testament," we see the things we would expect to find and some we may not. In response to verse 19 Wesley wrote, "We love him, because he first loved us — This is the sum of all religion, the genuine model of Christianity. None can say more: why should anyone say less, or less intelligibly?" This is the foundation of our faith.

Like any foundation we build up from there. In building our life of faith, we have to avoid the kind of construction that becomes hazardous. John Wesley has something to say about that in reference to verse 21: "That he who loveth god love his brother – Every one, whatever his opinions or mode of worship be, purely because he is the child, and bears the image, of God. Bigotry is properly the want of this pure and universal love. A bigot only loves those who embrace his opinions, and receive his way of worship; and he loves them for that, and not for Christ's sake. As we gather the Methodists of Minnesota and focus on being, "Created to Love Boldly," it is easy to slip into the bigotry of only loving those who agree with us and to love them simply because they agree with us. Please pray over our gathering that we will love with the same mindset and goal as Jesus, "that all of them may be one."

Carole reported for the Trustees that the drain that was plugged up in March cost us \$1150.00 to have repaired. Our operating permit for the City of Duluth has been completed and Jim will mail the appropriate check. The repair of the windows will be completed early this summer.

There has been a persistent leak in the back wall of the kitchen with water having to be cleaned up several times.

The Lamp Lighters visited both Shirley Olson and Vi Lyness in March, finding them both doing well.

Our Missions have included the monthly meal to the Loaves and Fishes folks, giving some food from the Food Shelf table to some folks from Wisconsin who spoke with Pastor Jeremy recently. Carole supplied information on a possible new charity for us to support at Thanksgiving, Christmas or Easter: The Bob Tavani House for medical respite for the unhoused. We can visit this at our next meeting.

National Night Out will be August 6, 2025 and will begin the process of pulling this neighborhood party together. Sandy will speak with Sue Brewer to "get us on the list."
